Topic: TWIC Program Plans: An Update

Biography: Lolie Kull is the Program Manager for the Transportation Security Administration's (TSA) Transportation Worker Identification Credential (TWIC) Program where, over the past year, she has seen the program through the Technology Evaluation Phase and has been a part of program preparations for the Prototype phase. The Prototype Phase is the third step in TSA's development of a uniform identification credential for all transportation workers who require unescorted access to secure areas at seaports, airports, rail, pipeline, trucking and mass transit facilities. The Prototype Phase will assess the performance of the conceptual TWIC identity management business processes. The ultimate goal of the TWIC Program is to improve security by establishing an integrated, credential-based, identity management program for all transportation workers requiring unescorted access to secure areas of the nation's transportation system.

Prior to joining the Department of Homeland Security, Ms. Kull was employed by the U.S. Department of State. In her last assignment at the Department of State, she was the Program Manager for the Bureau of Diplomatic Security, Office of Domestic Facility Protection Access Control and Smart Card Implementation Program. Her prior assignments included overseas duty in India and New Zealand.

Ms. Kull is a member of the Government Smart Card Interagency Advisory Board, the Federal Identity Credentialing Committee (FICC), and participates in numerous working groups under the FICC. In addition, she represents the TWIC Program as a member of the Smart Card Alliance and the Biometric Consortium.
