Dr. Lisa Nelson is an Assistant Professor in the Graduate School of Public and International Affairs at the University of Pittsburgh, an Affiliated Assistant Professor at the University of Pittsburgh School of Law, an Affiliated Assistant Professor in the InSITeS Institute for the study of law and technology at Carnegie Mellon University and a Fellow at the Philosophy of Science Center of the University of Pittsburgh.

Her expertise is in the areas of the philosophy of technology and science, biometrics and law, and legal ontology. She is a former MacArthur Foundation Scholar and has published in the areas of philosophy of science, jurisprudence and the social and legal implications of technology.
